Testing

O Teachers have had various concerns over the common assessments, and we need to remember that they are works in progress. When you meet with the members of your grade level committees, please discuss any possible changes that the assessments may need to be more effective. Also, in our attempts to cut back on the number of tests that students need to take each year, we proposed the elimination of the language section of the MAP test since it is not used for RTI purposes.

Instructional Rounds

O Showing the dedication of our teachers, numerous people asked if they could be a part of the instructional rounds that are a feature of the co-teaching professional development. Currently, teams of four from each school have been chosen to observe co-taught classrooms and report back to their peers. After discussing the interest from non-team members, Matt and Todd have agreed to expand the program starting in the spring. If you are a co-teacher and would like to be a part of the instructional rounds, please let your principal know.

Key Cards and School Access

O Teachers from various schools mentioned the difference in the times that they are able to enter their schools. Daryl Snyder said that it is up to the principal to determine the hours of availability. Please talk to your principal if you feel your school's access should be expanded.

AR Secretary's Report - Emily Roberts

The MEA Association Representatives met Thursday, October 8th, 2015, at the IEA Office, Moline. President Susie Hafner called the meeting to order at 3:48pm. There not being a quorum present, the meeting commenced with the Committee Chair reports.

Committee Chair Reports:

- Membership Heidi Norcross reported membership stands at 449.
- Elections Doug Bodeen reminded members of an upcoming election in November.
- Legislative no report.
- Region 18 no report.
- Public Relations no report.
- Social Aubree Savage asked representatives to sign-up to bring treats to the November AR meeting. ARs were given entry slips to sign for a door prize drawing at the end of the meeting.
- Grievance no report.
- Negotiations President Hafner asked ARs to consider topics to be included in the upcoming negotiations.

Old Business:

- Common Assessments assessments are works in progress. After being informed that teachers were purchasing supplemental materials for the new curriculum with personal funds, Assistant Superintendent Todd DeTaeye said teachers should bring receipts to their administrator for reimbursement. Teachers were encouraged to share ideas at grade level meetings.
- MAP President Hafner asked the ARs to discuss with colleagues the possible elimination of the language portion of the test and inform her if teachers agreed with eliminating the language portion.
- Administration discussed with the creator of EduClimber the possibility of allowing teachers to input their own data. Assistant Superintendent Matt DeBane will inform staff when/if this is available. President Hafner informed the members that if teachers are uncomfortable completing the on-line forms for Evaluwise, the evaluator must help walk them through the process of completing the forms.
- President Hafner noted that Co-Teaching with Dr. Kimberly Landrum was going well, and that all student and teachers transfers were completed.

New Business:

- President Hafner informed the members that at the semester, other teachers would be brought in to participate in the co-teaching instructional rounds.
- President Hafner requested and is awaiting the number of CHIs and Paras employed by the district.

President's Report:

- Superintendent Search members are encouraged to contact the Board of Education with opinions regarding the current Superintendent and Assistant Superintendents.
- Grading differentiation, especially in co-teaching classes, has a big impact on student grades. Since it is not noted on student report cards if grades are differentiated, there could be a possible negative effect on a student's college admittance. Members were asked to contact President Hafner with additional information or ideas.

At this time, there were 21 ARs and 12 Executive Board members in attendance; a quorum was present.

A motion was made by Christine Watts, seconded by Tricia Leibovitz, to approve the minutes of the September 10^{th} , 2015, AR meeting. **Motion** passed.

Treasurer Mary Nelson reported balances in all accounts. A motion to approve the treasurer's report was made by Jill Bogart, seconded by Liz Finch. **Motion** passed. It was voted (January 2015) to not publish the dollar amounts in the MEA budget in neither the minutes nor the Monitor. Members with questions regarding the MEA account balances are asked to contact Treasurer Mary Nelson.

A.R. Concerns:

- It was voted (2010-2011) to not publish AR concerns in the Monitor. ARs were reminded to communicate concerns discussed at the meeting with the other MEA members they represent. President Hafner will discuss most issues in the "President's Corner" section of the Monitor or send superintendent's responses directly to the ARs for dissemination to members.

There being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Colette Guerdet, seconded by Jay Bohnsack. **Motion** passed. The meeting adjourned at 4:25pm.
