Moline Education Association Association Representatives Meeting Thursday, September 10th, 2020

The MEA Association representatives met via Zoom on Thursday, September 10th, 2020. President Susie Hafner called the meeting to order at 3:37pm. There were 24 ARs and 14 Executive Board members in attendance; a quorum was present.

A motion was made by Lisa Welvaert, seconded by Heidi Norcross, to approve the minutes of the February 11th, 2020, AR meeting. **Motion** approved.

Treasurer Steve Sundberg reported balances in all accounts. A motion to approve the Treasurer's report was made by Heidi Norcross, seconded by Jill Bogart. **Motion** approved. It was voted (January 2015) to not publish the dollar amounts in the MEA budget in neither the minutes nor the Monitor. Members with questions regarding the MEA account balances are asked to contact Treasurer Steve Sundberg.

Committee Chair Reports:

- Membership Heidi Norcross reported that all new hires, except two, had joined MEA. She will take an Association Day to complete the roster.
- <u>Elections</u> Marigrace Alonso reported there would be an election in late December. She is currently trying to determine options for electronic voting.
- <u>Legislation</u> Raegan Jones reported that the IEA office has yard signs in support of the Fair Tax proposal, and encouraged members to help dispel the misconceptions regarding the Fair Tax.
- <u>Region 18</u> Lori Wesemann reported there was a meeting scheduled for 4:30pm.
- <u>Public Relations</u> Kim Anderson reported she is still trying to resolve issues with the MEA blog. Years of Service pins and certificates were being delivered to buildings.
- <u>Social</u> Aubree Krol reported plans for an event were being discussed.
- <u>Grievance/Negotiations</u> Colette Guerdet asked members to note what made their work easier/more difficult this year. An example given: academic freedom.

Old Business:

- President Hafner noted that WMS had added a teacher for the ED room; Matt Perkins gave a brief explanation of that room's structure and use.
- President Hafner noted that Vice-President Watts had worked with Dr. Prybil on elementary issues.

New Business:

- President Hafner encouraged members to continue with the good communication amongst the union, and asked that everyone complete the survey recently sent by Dr. Savage.

A.R. Concerns:

- It was voted (2010-2011) to not publish the AR concerns in the Monitor. ARs were reminded to communicate concerns discussed at the meeting with the other MEA members they represent. President Hafner will discuss most issues in the "President's Corner" section of the Monitor or send superintendent's responses directly to the ARs for dissemination to members.

There being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Erin Stuedeman, seconded by Heidi Norcross. **Motion** approved. The meeting adjourned at 4:24pm.
